PROGRAMMES



PSN: Pre-colonial Societies in Nigeria

Artworks, besides allowing viewers to experience multiple forms of beauty, meaning and skill, can also be an excellent educational resource to help persons of all ages engage, discover and learn about the history and culture of Nigeria.

The Pre-colonial Societies of Nigeria (PSN) program is designed to creatively educate students about ancient civilizations of Nigeria before colonial influence from Europe. Using artefacts from these civilizations as a point of reference, the students explore, discover and learn about these societies and how they operated, how they have changed and the historical relevance of their artefacts and culture to Nigeria. The pilot edition, launched in 2021, focused on the Benin Kingdom. The second edition, featuring the ancient Yoruba Civilization, will be launched in February 2022. Subsequent editions will center on other Nigerian historical societies.





AAP: Art Appreciation Programme

The Art Appreciation Program (AAP), launched in 2021, is designed for kids, 8 to 14 years, to learn about the elements of art including lines, shapes, form, space, color, texture etc. and how they are combined as symbols of visual language and expression by artists. The children also explore how art is part of their everyday life and how artists use their works to express their ideas and engage their viewers on different topics including culture, religion, environment, history, language and society.





Creative Workshop

Our creative workshops are activities designed to foster creativity and innovation among its participants. They include our textile print sessions and painting classes. Through these Programmes, YSMA offers a range of art activities (on request) that facilitate knowledge discovery and critical thinking to people of all ages and professions in a conducive environment. The workshops currently offered under this programme include Tie and dye, Adire making and PAINT.SIP.LEARN.



EXHIBITIONS

We launched a new exhibition titled 'The Invincible Hands'. This exhibition was curated by Olufisayo Bakare and generously sponsored by Art Friends. The Invincible Hands exhibition was officially opened on the 28th of August 2021 and ran throughout the year.

The 'Mirroring Man' exhibition, which was created last year 2020, remained in place through this year 2021. The exhibition catalogue for 'The Invincible Hands' exhibition is open and accessible on the YSMA website to our audience to promote online engagement.
