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Letter from the Director

2024 has been an extraordinary year for YSMA and Pan-Atlantic University. The museum continues to solidify its reputation as the leading university museum in West Africa, advancing its mission as a cultural and academic institution. Through impactful exhibitions, educational initiatives, and strategic partnerships, we deepened public engagement and fostered a greater appreciation for Nigeria's rich artistic heritage. None of this would have been possible without the firm support of our community, donors, and partners. This year, we reached new heights, welcoming close to 8,000 visitors—a proof of YSMA's growing recognition as a cultural hub. Our collection also expanded significantly, thanks to the generosity of artists who enriched our holdings with their works. These additions strengthened YSMA's role as a vital repository of Nigerian art and culture.

Our programming began with the YSMA Open House and the inauguration of the Students' Council. These events were followed by two major exhibitions. *Arewa?* offered a nuanced exploration of Northern Nigerian art, challenging stereotypes and sparking dialogue through workshops. Later in the year, *Collecting Now: Perspectives on Contemporary Art Collecting in Nigeria* opened in October and will run until February 2025. This exhibition provides an intimate look at the stories and motivations of six prominent collectors, including Advisory Board members Kola Aina, Dotun Sulaiman, Gbenga Oyebode, and Niyi Adenubi.

The museum also saw significant leadership developments. We welcomed three new members to our Advisory Board: Dr. Ibikunle Dashur, Ms. Adaora Ikenze, and Mr. Niyi Adenubi, further strengthening our leadership for the future. At year's end, Mr. Kola Aina stepped down as Chairman of the Advisory Board, leaving behind a legacy of vision and guidance. We are deeply grateful for his service. Stepping into the role is Mr. Dotun Sulaiman, a founding board member whose leadership will help us build on our strong foundation.

Beyond exhibitions, YSMA intensified its educational and outreach efforts. Our targeted awareness campaign positioned us as the preferred academic partner for art-related programs. From engaging secondary schools and introducing object-based learning across campus to hosting our annual HSE campers' camp and running a workshop for aspiring filmmakers at the MultiChoice Talent Factory, our initiatives continue to inspire and educate. These efforts are cementing YSMA's position as the leading educational museum in West Africa.

Looking ahead, YSMA remains committed to expanding its collection, fostering academic collaborations, and enhancing its role as a hub for contemporary art and cultural heritage. We are profoundly grateful to Prince Yemisi Shyllon, our supporters, and the Pan-Atlantic University community for their invaluable contributions. Your encouragement drives us forward, and we are excited for what we will accomplish together in the coming year.

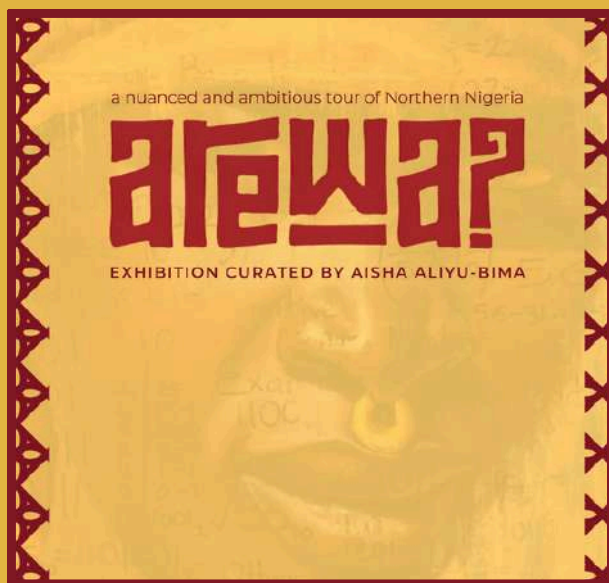


Exhibitions

Pre-Colonial Societies of Nigeria

The partnership involves the design, installation, and execution of an art exhibition, as well as the implementation of complementary programmes for curators, journalists, and teachers.

The Yemisi Shyllon Museum of Art (YSMA), Pan Atlantic University, Lagos, and Africa No Filter (ANF), a Lagos-based art gallery, are set to launch a new art exhibition titled 'AREWAT' in collaboration with Africa No Filter, scheduled to open in July 18 October 2024 at the Pan Atlantic University.



The exhibition will offer an in-depth look at the personal and curatorial journeys of six leading Nigerian art collectors who have played a pivotal role in shaping the contemporary art landscape in the country.
